REGULAR TOWNSHIP COUNCIL MEETING

June 11, 2012

The Regular Meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Vernon was convened at 7:30pm on June 11, 2012, in the Vernon Township Municipal Building, 21 Church Street, Vernon, New Jersey.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

Adequate notice of this meeting had been provided to the public and the press on January 9, 2012, and was posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-6.

ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

Present were Council Members Eddie Dunn, Daniel Kadish, Patrick Rizzuto, Dick Wetzel and Council President Brian Lynch. Also present were Mayor Vic Marotta, Business Administrator Jerry Giaimis, and Township Attorney Kevin Kelly.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG

Council President Lynch led the assemblage in the salute to the flag.

Council President Lynch moved the Public Auction on the Agenda to after the Mayor's Report.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

The Council President opened the meeting to public comments at this time.

Mary Bradley, expressed her thanks to everyone, and especially to Mayor Marotta and Missy Wiedbrauk, for all their help in making Vernon Day a success. Council President Lynch stated that Mary Bradley needed to be thanked also for all of her efforts.

Robert Winter, thanked the Mayor and Council for getting the podium fixed at the Memorial Park for Memorial Day.

Sandy Ooms, Vernon, is interested in the community garden; Council President Lynch suggested she make an appointment with the Mayor regarding this.

Bob Gerry, Vernon, discussed the poor visibility at the Maple Grange Road intersection.

Gary Martinsen, questioned the progress of getting the resolutions and other things on our Website.

CLOSED TO PUBLIC COMMENTS

No one else wished to speak at this time, and the Council President asked for a motion to close the public portion of the meeting.

All Members present were in favor.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Marotta discussed the COAH funds that will be used for senior affordable housing and the State requirements. The Township advertised for Request for Proposals for Senior Affordable Housing, and the due date was today. The Township is in receipt of a proposal by Theta 456 Associated LLC, the Mayor asked the Council to peruse the information and be prepared to discuss and move on this at the next Council meeting. The Mayor explained that if the funds that are allocated for affordable housing is not used within a certain time, the State of New Jersey, DCA, has said that they will confiscate those funds in the amount of \$258,000.00, which he would not like to see happen. Mayor Marotta suggested the Council consider a resolution directing

that the COAH funds be moved into a line item as a sub-category of affordable housing and left there until it is decided whether to accept the proposal that was submitted or what ever action the Township decides to take.

The Mayor discussed the construction project on Maple Grange Road and the Department of Transportation grant that will cover a portion of the expense. This project is a joint project between Sussex County and Vernon Township.

The Mayor spoke of the progress since Hurricane Irene – 22 of the 40 projects that the Township is involved in have been reviewed by FEMA; and in every case, we are being reimbursed at the absolute maximum allowed under Federal law, which is 75%. Out of \$219,000.00 worth of repairs that the Township has provided on the projects listed, we are receiving a reimbursement of \$164,262.00. This is a result of our people doing their job right and that also includes our Department of Public Works. Four of Vernon's lake communities – Lake Wallkill, Highland Lakes, Barry Lakes and Stonehill Condominiums will be receiving \$116,391.00 and that is a direct result of the efforts of Mr. Zuckerman, our CFO and Mr. Giaimis, our Business Administrator, in processing the paperwork for FEMA.

Mayor Marotta discussed the acquisition of the abandoned Camp Sussex property - the Township has sold approximately \$495,000.00 in tax sale certificates on this property when someone bought the certificates. The Mayor recommended to the Council that they consider purchasing those tax certificates back, paying the interest, and foreclosing on this property for the purpose of use by Vernon Township for recreation. The Mayor requested that the Environmental Commission review this proposal and make a suggestion; he will also attend the next Environmental Commission meeting to discuss this. Mayor Marotta suggested discussing the issue more thoroughly at a work session.

The Council President clarified the reasons for a special meeting: 1) to discuss the COAH money; and 2) to discuss working on Maple Grange. The Mayor suggested also for the Council to award the bid – it has to be awarded before the 24th. The Council decided to have this special meeting on June 19th at 8:00 pm.

Mayor Marotta reported that he will be absent the following week, and in his absence he would be appointing Mr. Jerry Giaimis as our Acting Mayor.

Lastly, the Mayor noted that tomorrow evening at 8:00 pm, on Channel 10 SECTV, "Vernon Vibes" program would be broadcast with Mayor Vic Marotta hosting. The Mayor invited the public to tune in and hear what's happening in the Mayor's office and in Vernon Township.

PUBLIC AUCTION

Public Auction – Block 159.02 Lot 26, 14 Pine Street East per Ordinance #12-09 adopted May 14, 2012. The three eligible bidders who own contiguous properties are at 12 Pine Street East, 16 Pine St. East and 18 Pine St. East/2 Spruce St. The Township Attorney, Mr. Kelly, stated this was previously postponed on the agenda to give the prospective bidders time to attend the meeting. The only prospective bidder was Mr. and Mrs. Canning, who accepted the bid price of \$200.00, with an additional \$450.00 per the ordinance. Mr. Kelly explained that a deed would be put together for them. Mayor Marotta thanked Mr. & Mrs. Canning for purchasing this property, as it was quite an eyesore in the community.

WHEREAS, Hurricane Irene and subsequent storms had seriously damaged several roads in the Township; and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Irene and subsequent storms had damaged a section of Glenwood Mountain Road which needed immediate repairs and the Township's Public Work's Director has certified that such an emergency existed with respect to these repairs and the use of EARTH-TEC ASSOCIATES, INC; and

WHEREAS, the Purchasing Agent recommends that the Township Council award an emergency contract to repair and replace this section of Glenwood Mountain Road to EARTH-TEC ASSOCIATES, INC., PO Box 941, Vernon, New Jersey 07462; and

WHEREAS, the total cost for this contract is \$19,945.00 and the Chief Financial Officer, of the Township of Vernon, has certified these funds are available in account #101427.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Vernon, that the vendor, EARTH-TEC ASSOCIATES, INC., be awarded an emergency contract, in accordance with the attached bill in the amount not to exceed \$19,945.00; and

Mr. Rizzuto also complimented the Mayor and staff for putting together the paperwork for FEMA in such a timely manner so that we could achieve the maximum awards from FEMA. Mr. Rizzuto was

unable to attend Vernon Day but wanted to comment that it was a wet experience (pertaining to Mayor Marotta being in the dunk tank).

Council Member Kadish commented on the weather on Vernon Day and had two complaints. One being the cost of stocking the Fisherman's Pond of \$1,000.00, and suggested either posting a sign or passing an ordinance to penalize adults for fishing in the pond, which is supposed to be for children. Mr. Kadish commented that posting signs on utility poles is illegal, and we should put a stop to it. Mayor Marotta stated that the Zoning Officer is aware of it and will be issuing summonses.

Council Member Dunn commented on the wonderful service the Vernon Ambulance Squad provided for him when he had to be escorted to the hospital the week before. Mr. Dunn also thanked Mary Bradley for all her work and efforts that she put into Vernon Day.
