ORDINANCE #23-18

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION OF GOVERNMENT" TO UPDATE REORGANIZATION AND TERM START DATES

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2023, P.L. 2023, c. 124, was enacted which changed several election related timelines including reorganization dates and term start dates in municipalities with non-partisan elections; and

WHEREAS, a determination has been made that the Township of Vernon's municipal code must be amended to comply with the aforementioned legislative changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Township of Vernon, County of Sussex, and State of New Jersey that the Township Code shall be amended as follows:

SECTION 1

§ 5-3. Office of the Mayor.

G. Election; term of office. The Mayor shall be elected by the voters of the Township at a regular municipal election held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November in the years in which municipal officers are to be elected and shall serve for a term of four (4) years beginning on January 415 next following his or her election.

§ 5-4. Township Council.

C. Membership; term of office. The Township Council shall consist of five (5) members, elected at-large by the voters of the Township at a regular municipal election held on the Tuesday after the first Monday in November in the years in which municipal officers are to be elected. The terms of the members of the Council shall be four (4) years, beginning on January <u>115</u> next following their election.

§ 5-6. Meetings of Council.

- C. Regular meetings.
 - (1) The Council shall meet annually for organization within seven (7) days of January 1st 15th.

SECTION 2

Each section of this ordinance is an independent section, and the holding of any section or part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity of constitutionality of any other sections or parts thereof.

SECTION 3

Any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to their inconsistencies only.

SECTION 4

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately as provided by law.

Jessica DeBenedetto – feels that there should be a police officer patrolling the area often by Fields of Green School.

Jan Messick – expressed concern about a dog sanctuary across the street from her home. She questioned if the animals need to be licensed.

Seeing no other members of the public wishing to speak, President Buccieri asked for a motion to close the meeting for Public Comments.

MAYOR COMMENTS

In coordination with the Sussex County based Center for Prevention & Counseling, this year the Township of Vernon will actively participate in the international observance of OVERDOSE AWARENESS DAY on August 31. In addition, I have made a decision to extend Vernon Township's participation to include the support of NATIONAL RECOVERY MONTH, which promotes efforts to bring awareness of our county's life-saving addiction recovery resources and services. While there are a host of symbolic things that our town will work on in coordination with the Sussex County based Center for Prevention & Counseling, the most visual manifestation of the municipality's support will be wording on the Municipal Electronic Message Board in front of the Municipal Center, and the illumination of this Electronic Message Board in the NATIONAL RECOVERY MONTH's color of purple. It is my hope that our municipality's efforts will contribute to letting those who suffer from the disease of addiction know that recovery is possible; and contribute to letting those who have lost a family member or friend to overdose know that we understand, and that we care.

Before I assumed the position of Mayor, our town had never had its own formal ceremony of observance to honor the memory of those who our country lost on that dreadful day of September 11, 2001. When I discovered this, I decided to change that; and, in 2020 I worked close with the Municipal Director of Community Affairs, Ms. MISHELLE DOWNTAIN, to plan and host Vernon Township's first ANNUAL 9/11 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY. Additionally, it was my hope that before my 4-year term as Mayor was over, that I would be able to somehow establish a meaningful, significant foundation that would be viewed and accepted by the town as the start a permanent VERNON TOWNSHIP 9/11 REMEMBRANCE MEMORIAL. On tonight, I am extremely pleased to report to the Council and the public, that after three plus years of trying to make this hope a reality, with the help and focused efforts of Director of Community Affairs DOWNTAIN, along with the very valuable assistance of Ms. VERNOY PALOINI, a Vernon resident, a retired Vernon School District educator, and a person who currently works at the National 9/11 Memorial and Museum - - with the help and focused efforts of these two outstanding individuals, Vernon has finally been successful in acquiring the key, special item that we wanted to obtain and use as the foundation for a permanent VERNON TOWNSHIP 9/11 REMEMBRANCE MEMORIAL! That key, special item is a seedling from the 9/11 Survivor Tree! The 9/11 Survivor Tree is a tree that was severely damaged, with snapped roots and burned branches, that was discovered at Ground Zero in October 2001. This tree was dug up and removed from the rubble of Ground Zero, and then placed in the care and treatment of the New York City Department of Parks and Recreation. After nine years of nursing this tree back to recovery and rehabilitation, in 2010 it was returned to and replanted at the site of the 9/11 Memorial & Museum. New, smooth limbs extended from the knotted and twisted stumps of the now recovered and surviving tree, creating a visible demarcation between the tree's past and present. Today, the tree stands as a living reminder of resilience, survival, and rebirth. Since 2010, the 9/11 Memorial & Museum has received thousands of requests for seedlings from this special tree. Each year, hundreds these requests are received from not just municipalities and organizations in our country, but also from countries and organizations throughout the world. However, the 9/11 Memorial & Museum grants only a small number of these requests each year. And, for 2023, Vernon Township was one of the fortunate recipients of a seedling from the 9/11 Survivor Tree! On Tuesday, August 22, I dispatched a Municipal Delegation to New York City to take possession of our 9/11 Survivor Tree Seedling, and to transport it with care to Vernon Township. Consistent with the 9/11 Memorial & Museum's requirements that this special tree be handled with and given the best possible care, our 9/11 Survivor Tree Seedling has been professionally planted in front of the Vernon Municipal Center by a Vernon located and New Jersey Landscape Contractors Association approved company, the NOTCHWOOD LANDSCAPE company. On behalf of the residents of Vernon Township, I thank NOTCHWOOD LANDSCAPE for providing this very valuable professional service at no charge to the Vernon Taxpayers. At this year's ANNUAL 9/11 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY, we will be dedicating this Survivor Tree Seedling as Vernon's living memorial to the three Vernon residents that were killed during the 9/11 attack, as well as all of the other victims of 9/11 and their families. This Survivor Tree Seedling will also serve as Vernon's living reminder of the resilience and survival of our nation and the American spirit. This year, 9/11 comes on a regular workday; and, so as to give as many individuals as possible the opportunity to be a part of this historic Survivor Tree Seedling dedication, we will be hosting the Municipality's ANNUAL 9/11 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY on Saturday morning, September 9, at 9am. I invite the Council and all other Vernon residents to join with me as a part of this historic event!
